GUM DISEASE IS ACTIVE IN VARYING DEGREES

TYPE I

Inflammation of the gingival, characterized clinically by changes in color, gingival form, position, surface appearance and/or presence of bleeding and/or exudates. There may not be any pockets.

TYPE II

Progression of the gingival inflammation into the deeper periodontal structures and alveolar bone crest, with slight loss. The usual periodontal probing depth is 3-4mm with slight loss of connective tissue attachment and slight loss of alveolar bone.

TYPE III

A more advance stage of the above condition with increased destruction of the periodontal structures with noticeable loss of bone support possible. Accompanied by an increase in tooth mobility. There may be furcation involvement in multirooted teeth. Consider possibility of referral to specialist after root planning and scaling.
